#### Requirements for Renewal of Firearms Permit (BPC Sections 7542, 7583.32, 7596.7 and CCR Section 633)

A BSIS Firearms Permit expires two years from the date of issuance. In order to renew the permit, the applicant must:

- **\*\* Must have completed two (2) range qualifications on a firing range every twelve (12) months and at least four (4) months apart. Applicants must complete four (4) total range qualifications prior to renewal of the Firearms Permit at a Bureau-approved firearm training facility and from a Bureau-approved firearm training instructor. All range qualifications must be certified by a Bureau-approved Firearms Training Facility. Applicants must also;**
- **\*\* Must have completed the two-hour review training course in the use of force and de-escalation of force before each requalification; and**
- **\*\* Must complete and submit a Firearms Permit Renewal Application; and**
- **\*\* Must include a new Firearm Eligibility Application with the Renewal Application.**

The application for renewal should be submitted to the Bureau at least 60 days before the expiration date of the permit to provide sufficient time for processing. **Please note:** You may not renew your Firearms Permit once it has expired. If you allow your BSIS Firearms Permit to expire, you must apply for a new permit.
